


ARRIS International, plc (ARRIS) California Transparency in Supply Chains Act of 2010 Statement

Our ARRIS International, plc including its worldwide subsidiaries (ARRIS) business principles are supported by our Policy on Business Ethics and Code of Conduct, Supplier Code of Conduct, Environmental, Health & Safety, Human Rights, and relating policies.

Our codes and policies address various concerns, including those specified by the State of California, and our Human Rights Policy expressly includes the right to freely chosen employment.

Our processes for monitoring compliance with our corporate governance requirements include a direct material supplier monitoring program. Through this program, we conduct supplier risk assessments and reviews. Audits of various types – from self-audit questionnaires to third-party audits – are utilized. ARRIS may provide notice to suppliers of a pending audit, depending upon the circumstances. ARRIS also provides ongoing code of conduct and policy training for employees responsible for supply chain management.

Our procedures are designed to verify that suppliers for ARRIS comply with the laws regarding free labor practices, including restrictions on slavery and human trafficking, in the countries where ARRIS and our direct suppliers do business. A supplier's failure to adhere to our requirements will result in action being taken to resolve the issue or to terminate the supplier relationship.
